- **Race** refers to the concept of categorizing people by various sets of physical and biological characteristics, as well as the process of ascribing social meaning to those groups.
- **Ethnicity** describes the culture of a people in a given geographic region, including their language, heritage, religion, and customs.

Race and ethnicity are separate concepts but the way we see them often overlaps.

Why is that? What are instances in which race and ethnicity might overlap?

Race and ethnicity, in the way many countries with mixed racial and ethnic populations experience, are notoriously ambiguous and lack inclusivity. For example, for many years folks who identified as Middle Eastern were guided to select Asian or Caucasian (White) as their respective race. It's only recently that efforts to change this have been started.
